

INFECTION CONTROL PROCEDURE 2016

Clean - Disinfect - Store

It is the responsibility of all practitioners, designated salon managers and owners to ensure that all infection control requirements are followed.



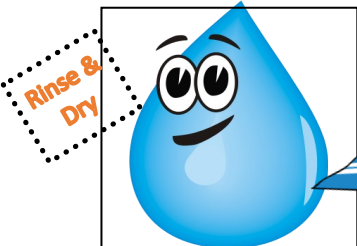
1. Wash hands with soap and water, dry with single service towel, cloth or air dryer before any service.

60% alcohol may be used in lieu of hand washing when hands are free of product or visible soil.



2. Clean surface or item and remove visible debris. Remove disposable parts and discard, wash item with soap and water or a cleaning agent.

Cleansing agents not in original container must have legible label with name of agent and use instructions.



3. Rinse thoroughly and dry before disinfection.

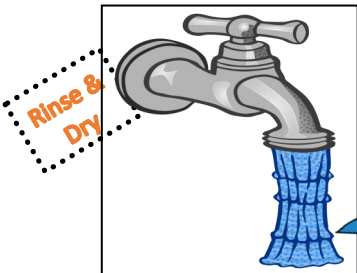
Rinsing and drying the item removes excess soap and water which if left on the items can hinder the disinfection process.



4. All surfaces of a tool or implement including handle must be disinfected by fully submerging.

Mixing & Use; Follow Mfg Directions

Container must have a cover and be large enough to fully submerge items and tools in disinfectant.



5. Rinse and dry items and tools.

Never store items and tools wet or with disinfectant residue. Following this step gives longer life to tools and implements and protects you and your clients/patients.



6. Store in a clean closed covered container cupboard or drawer or on a clean towel, under a clean towel or drape.

No plastic or paper bags, no sealed wrappings unless autoclaved.

Containers must have solid sides with lids and must be cleaned and disinfected weekly or when soiled.
